





NATUR HOTEL LÄRCHENHOF & SPA



HUNTING AREA REITH / SEEFELD



The hunting grounds of our Partner Marcati Hotels & More are located between 1,200 and 3,000 meters above sea level.

The hunting ground Reith is located directly adjacent to Seefeld. In this very well accessible area, it is possible to hunt red deer, roe deer and chamois and there are sufficient hunting boxes available. The hunt does not require long marches and is therefore optimally suited for elderly guests.

Reith is a municipality with over 1,000 inhabitants in the district Innsbruck Land in Tyrol (Austria). The small town is situated at the foot of the 2,374 meters high Reither Spitze at the southern edge of the Seefelder Plateau, above the Inntal, from where a road leads over the Zirler Berg. The municipal area includes the villages Auland, Gschwandt, Krinz, Leithen, Mühlberg and the Haufendorf Reith.



HUNTING AREA GALTUER



The Galtuer area lies in the midst of the magnificent Tyrolean mountains. Galtuer, despite the tourist development a traditional village with a rustic character, attracts with unique views and much untouched nature.

In addition to active hunting, it is also a unique opportunity to observe the local game species in their natural habitat.

A total of approx. 10,300 hectares of alpine and high alpine landscape offer unique hunting experiences for rock deer, red deer, roe deer, and of course chamois. In

addition, hunting for black grouse, capercaillie and marmots is possible.

In the center of Galtuer you will find the hunting house with several bedrooms — furthermore there is the possibility to spend the night in one of the two hunting cabins belonging to the hunting ground in order to recover from the stalk. The good accessibility of the hunting ground also enables hunters with limited mobility to enjoy an alpine hunting experience — our supervisory hunters are equipped with the appropriate vehicles and are very familiar with the hunting ground.

Raised hide or stalking

HUNTING RULES:

Before the start of the hunt each hunting guest needs to purchase a hunting license for the respective state. This hunting license is organized by the tour operator. All hunting guests are requested to present a valid hunting license before the start of the hunt. For EU citizens holding a valid hunting license, administration can issue a guest hunting license.

TROPHIES:

As trophies of killed hoofed game have to be submitted for exhibition in March of the subsequent year, they should be left in our custody up to that time. If desired, trophies can be taken home, but they have to be returned for exhibition. The trophies have to be submitted for exhibition at the fair by the end of March.

TEST SHOT:

To ensure compliance with hunting principles and above all to be able to guarantee a successful hunt, a test shot should be made with the hunting guide prior to the hunt.

Shooting game of specific desired class or quality cannot be guaranteed. Instructions of hunting guides and shooting range staff are to be followed at all times. They strive to enable you to enjoy carefree and successful hunting days and they always give their best. Please trust in their experience and guidance.
