CURRENCY

1 Canadian dollar (CAD) = 100 cents



TIME DIFFERENCE

Multiple time zones

The difference ranges from CET -9h (West Coast) to CET -5h (East Coast)

Newfoundland Standard Time (NST) CET -4.5h (St. John)

Atlantic Standard Time (AST) CET -5h (Halifax)

Eastern Standard Time (EST) CET -6h (Toronto, Montreal)

Central Standard Time (CST) CET -7h (Winnipeg, Regina)

Mountain Standard Time (MST) CET -8h (Edmonton, Calgary)

Pacific Standard Time (PST) CET -9h (Vancouver)

Canadian Summer Time (standard time plus one hour) applies from

the second Sunday in March to the first Sunday in November.

Saskatchewan (Regina) is the only province in Canada that does not have daylight saving time.



CLIMATE

There are large differences because of the size of the country. There is a humid Pacific climate on the west coast, a dry continental climate in the Prairie Provinces and an Atlantic climate influenced by the Gulf Stream in the east. The temperate climate zone is relatively narrow, and the arctic climate extends into the inhabited areas. Average temperatures range from -20° C to $+25^{\circ}$ C, while extreme temperatures range from -40° C to $+40^{\circ}$ C. In the cold season, you need appropriate equipment.

HUNTING IN NORTH & SOUTH BRITISH-COLUMBIA



NORTHERN BRITISH COLUMBIA

HUNTING AREA

The hunting ground in northern British Columbia is located 2 hours from Whitehorse. The only access is via seaplane or boat. Glaciers have shaped the striking coastal mountains. The rough country with numerous lakes and

streams offer a dreamlike atmosphere for hunting. We offer hunts for Mountain Goat, Canadian Moose, Stone Sheep, Mountain Caribou, Black Bear and Wolf.

HUNT

The hunting season in northern areas starts with the spring hunting of Black Bears. During this time, there is a possibility to hunt Wolves. The beginning of the hunt depends on the melting of snow.


Experience has shown that at the end of May, and beginning of June the lake can be traveled by boat.

From August 1st, Mountain Goat and Stone Sheep can

be hunted. On August 15th, hunts start on Moose and Caribou. Except Moose, all other hunting seasons closed on October 15th.

Depending on the type of hunted species, the hunt takes 8 or 12 days. In general, the hunts are hunt guidance 1:1. Besides boats, ATV's are also used for transportation.

ACCOMMODATION



Most of the hunts take place from cabins or partially heated tents. When hunting Mountain Goats and Stone



Sheep it is possible that you will be accommodated in a spike camp for several nights.

POSSIBLE ITINERARY (12 DAYS HUNT)

DAY 01: Departure form Europe, arrival & overnight **DAY 02:** Meet and greet at the hotel and transfer to camp

DAY 03–12: 10 Hunting days

DAY 13: Transfer to the airport and if needed overnight

DAY 14: Return flight
DAY 15: Arrival in Europe

If species are not harvest by lack off opportunities, the trophy fee will be refunded. Wounded game is considered shot and thus is charged for. All guests automatically receive a Wolf license.

SOUTHERN BRITISH COLUMBIA

HUNTING AREA

The southern hunting area is located in the Oaknagan Valley; it is about an hour's flight east of Vancouver in southern Canada. The region is well known for vineyards and offers excellent Puma and Wapiti trophies. A special feature is the hunt for Shiraz Moose, which occurs in

addition to the Canadian Moose in British Columbia. The hunting area is easily accessible by forest roads and offers the hunter the best conditions. We offer hunts for puma, wapiti, Shiraz moose, black bear.

HUNTING

From beginning of May, there is the possibility to hunt for Black. The hunting of Wapiti starts on September 10th and takes place mainly during the rut. The hunting season of Shiraz Moose starts on October 1st and ends on November 30th. Depending on snow conditions, using snowmobiles is possible.

Puma can be hunted from mid-November. The hunt takes place with dogs — they search for fresh tracks made by Puma.

As in the northern hunting grounds, the duration of hunting is 8 and 12 hunting days. In general, the hunts are guided 1:1.

ACCOMMODATION





The hunts are done mostly from cabins.

POSSIBLE ITINERARY (10 DAYS HUNT)

DAY 01/02: Departure form Europe, arrival & overnight stay

or arrival, transfer from the airport to the camp

DAY 03–10: 8 hunting days

DAY 11: Transfer to the airport and if needed overnight

DAY 12: Return flight
DAY 13: Arrival in Europe



 $1x\ Good\ broken$ in hiking boots with Gore Tex ("Meindl", "Island" or "Makalu")

1x Shoes for the camp (sneakers or loafers)

1x Qualitative good raincoat with hood and rain pants (material should be breathable for example Gore-Tex) it should be so large that it easily fits over normal clothing, ideally you should not have to take off your shoes

1x Gloves

1x Warm gloves

1x Backpack with bearer frame min 80 liters

1x Warm light sleeping bag (comfort range to -10°C, ideal down)

1x cotton-ticking for sleeping bag
1x Sleeping pad ("Thermarest" or "Exped")
1x Seat pad
Toiletries and small towel
Mosquito repellent
Spare glasses
Sunscreen
Photography equipment
Hunting knives (switchblades with belt pouch, blade max. 9cm)
Small flashlight with spare batteries and belt pouch
Water bottle 1 liter
Personal medication
Hunting rifle with scope with air travel compatible case
Cleaning supplies
40 rounds ammunition
Bullet pouch
Binoculars (8x30, 8x40 or 10x40)

IMPORTANT FOR THE TRIP:

Weapon and ammunition packed separately! Also, do not carry/pack any ammunition or a knife in your carry-on luggage. Since 01.01.2001, the Canadian Customs requires a completed, so-called "Firearm declaration" (rifle import permit). If we have already handed out this form in advance, please do not sign it. The signature must be made in the presence of a Canadian customs officer upon inspection.
