Canadian Summer Time (standard time plus one hour) applies from the second Sunday in March to the first Sunday in November.

Saskatchewan (Regina) is the only province in Canada that does not have daylight saving time.



CLIMATE

There are large differences because of the size of the country. There is a humid Pacific climate on the west coast, a dry continental climate in the Prairie Provinces and an Atlantic climate influenced by the Gulf Stream in the east. The temperate climate zone is relatively narrow, and the arctic climate extends into the inhabited areas.

Average temperatures range from -20°C to +25°C, while extreme temperatures range from -40°C to +40°C. In the cold season, you need appropriate equipment.

Saskatchewan:

There are four different seasons in Saskatchewan. The average temperature varies between -25 degrees Celsius (-13 degrees Fahrenheit) in winter and 25°C (77°F) in summer.

In winter, the average temperatures vary between 0°C and -24°C (32 and -11°F) and in summer, between 15°C and 30°C (59 and 89°F).

Far from any major stretch of water, Saskatchewan has a continental temperature climate. It is Canada's sunniest province and the second receiving the least snow each year (145 cm – 8.85 inches).

It is also the one with the hottest summer 22°C (71.6°F) and the fourth receiving the least precipitation each year (428 mm – 1.4 inch).

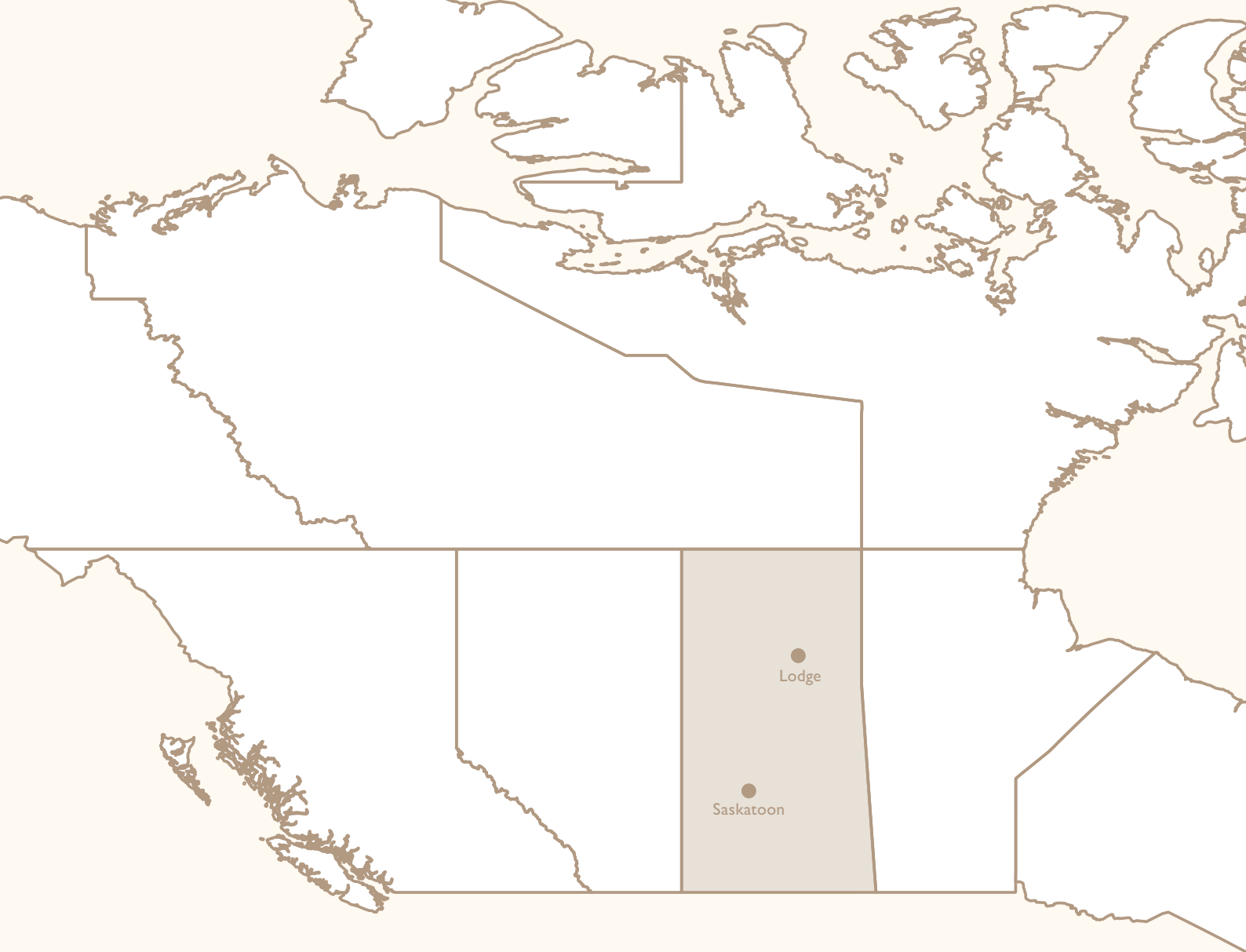
Vaccinations

SASKATCHEWAN

HUNTING AREA

Located in the heart of Saskatchewan, on a huge private land of 800,000 hectares, GGO & WTO runs along a provincial park. It is a preferred habitat, namely for (whitetail) deer and black bears, with its valleys and rivers at the edge of the boreal forest and farmlands.

Very few places in the world can boast of harboring trophy class whitetail deer like in Saskatchewan, which actually holds the world record of the largest deer harvested. This deer was shot by Milo Hanson on November 23, 1993 and had a total score of more than 213 Boone & Crockett points!

GAME

The key to their success – harvesting of adult bucks scoring under 150 Boone & Crockett points is prohibited for GGO! Because of their prime deer habitat, remarkable game genetic characteristics, our feeding program, continuous monitoring of deer, and predator management, our Deer Management Program has successfully been producing world-class bucks for the last 25 years.

We have already harvested giant bears of more than 7 feet and weighing more than 500 lbs, while a bear measuring 6 ½ feet, weighing up to 350 lbs and possessing a skull of more than 20 inches can be considered a big beast. Our record: a skull measuring 21 7/8 inches Pope and Young!

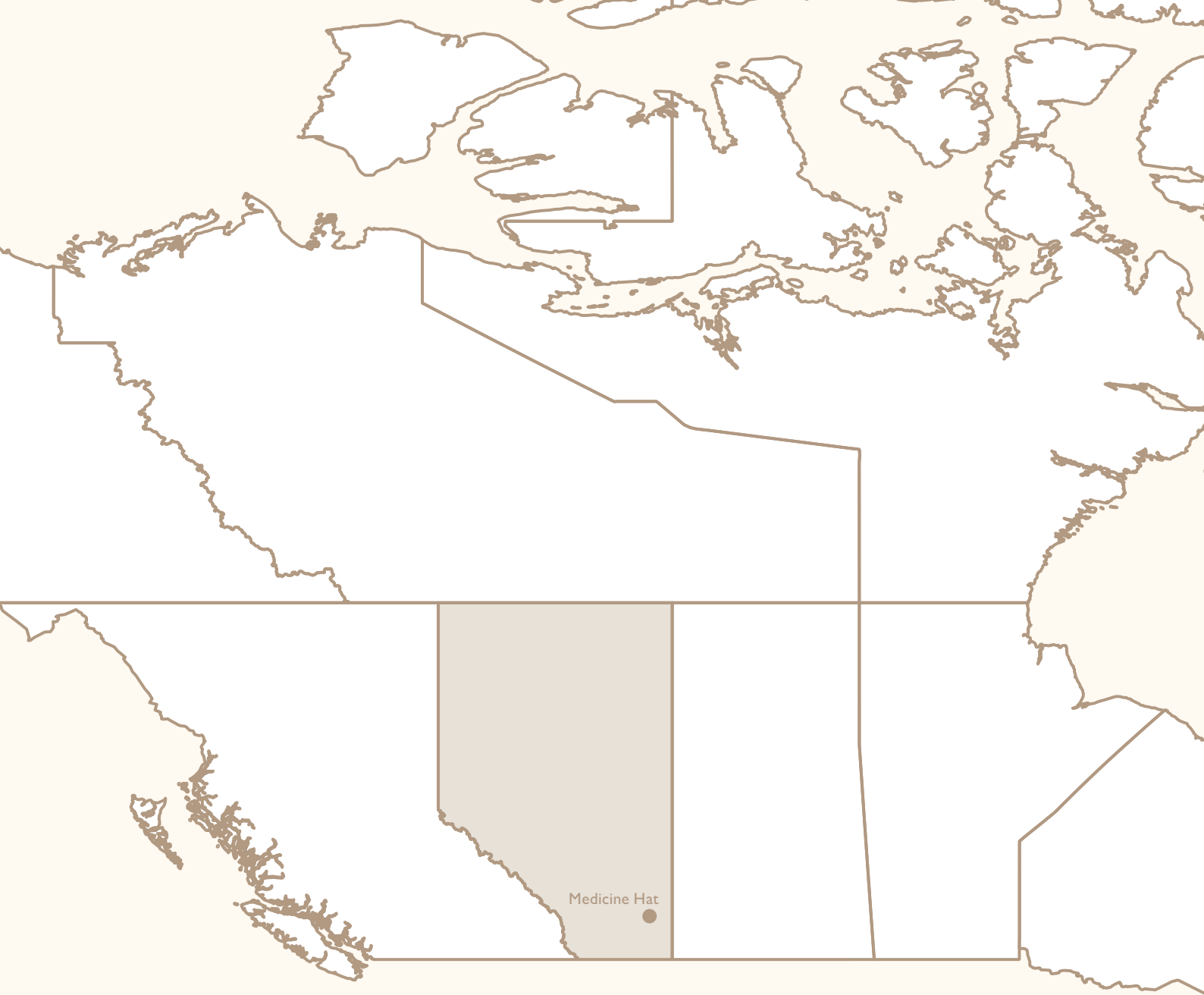

ALBERTA

HUNTING AREA

Their Open Country Foothills and Prairie spot and stalk style Mule Deer and Antelope hunts have gained wide-spread acclaim in recent years by hunters from all over North America and beyond. These are their most popular hunts and many of their mule deer and Pronghorn hunters routinely report seeing

over 100 animals per day during their hunt. Officially, they state that they hope to show their hunters minimum 160 class mule deer; however, their experience indicates that each year many of their hunters harvest 180 class mule's and sometimes 190+ class. They offers both archery and rifle hunting experiences in some of Alberta's finest mule deer territories.

ACCOMMODATION

GENERAL HUNT INFORMATION

HUNTING PERMIT

The cost of hunting permits (included in the hunt Package) varies depending on the type of game (deer, black bear or Waterfowl) and whether or not you are a Canadian resident.

To get a hunting permit, you must provide a picture of your driver's license or passport.

Note that the cost of the hunting permit can change without warning, depending on the decisions made by the government. If this is the case, you must pay the difference between the cost of the permit at the time of purchase and the change implemented by the government.

FIREARM ENTRY INTO CANADA

To meet the standards of the Firearms Act, visitors/ non-residents of Canada must fill out a declaration to import weapons into Canada.

You must declare your weapons in writing, in triplicate, via the Non-Resident Firearms Declaration form, available on the Royal Canadian Mounted Police website (form CAFC909).

To have your request processed as quickly as possible at the point of entry, make sure to fill out the declaration form in advance; however, wait to be at the entry point to sign it as your signature must be attested by a customs officer.

Once a Canada Border Services Agency officer attests your declaration, the latter serves as a temporary permit and registration certificate for all firearms brought into Canada. The declaration is valid for 60 days.

The attested declaration will cost you \$25, regardless of the number of firearms you bring.

The declaration is valid for the signatory only, and only for the weapons registered on it.

ARMS & WEAPONS

If you want to use a rifle, we recommend a minimum caliber of 270. Here are the applicable rules for deer hunting weapons:

- FOR NON-RESIDENT:**
- From September 1st to October 31st with bow, cross-bow and powder rifle
 - From October 1st to December 7th with rifle

HUNTING INFORMATION

IF YOU HUNT AT GREAT GREY OUTFITTERS:
Anyone who shoots a deer with antlers measuring less than 150 B&C, as measured according to the method of the recognized Boone & Crockett scale, will be fined \$1,000 immediately.

IF YOU HUNT AT WESTERN TROPHY OUTFITTERS: No minimum score for the Hunters that will hunt at WTO and no penalty fees

WOUNDED ANIMALS

Our partner want to protect the wildlife on the WTO outfitters territory and because of that, we recommend you practice your shooting to avoid wounding any animal. If an animal is wounded and not found, your hunt must stop immediately until your guide (the outfitters) decides otherwise. We need time to take all the necessary measures to recover wounded animals before resuming the hunting activity.

IT IS THE HUNTING LAW IN SASKATCHEWAN:
useless waste of big game must stop. Western Trophy Outfitters respects and applies the laws applicable in Saskatchewan and asks that its hunters do the same.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Deposit required for booking your hunt at the signature on the hunting contract. Balance is due in full 4 months prior to you hunting date.
