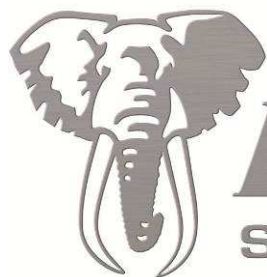

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Hunting in Greenland

Our partner LAX-Á Angling & Hunting Club is experienced in working with hunters from all over the world. They have over 15 year's background in Greenland and are knowledgeable of the country and its people. For many years the hunting success rate has been 100 %.



The Country

Greenland is the world's largest island. Having a surface of 2.18 million km² and only about 59,000 inhabitants it is one of the least densely populated regions in the world. The capital city is Nuuk, which has not more than 12,000 inhabitants. A large part of the country is always covered with ice, which can reach a thickness of 3,500m. About one sixth of the island is ice-free.

Away from the coasts, the inland is dominated by inhospitable ice and cold deserts. Arctic climate prevails with maximum temperatures from 20 °C in the south to -5 °C in the north. In winter lowest temperatures are around -50 °C.



Muskox

The best known game of Greenland is, besides Polar Bear and Polar Fox, the Muskox (*Ovibos Moschatus*) whose main distribution areas are the Arctic regions of Canada and Greenland.

This interesting species has also been successfully introduced to Alaska, Norway, Spitsbergen and the Russian Tamyr Peninsula. Mature bulls stand from 110cm to 150cm high at the shoulder and weigh between 300 kg and 400 kg.

Muskoxen are social animals living in small herds. Most of the time, herds are led by a mature female, while the strongest bull protects the group. Old bulls are often loners or gather in smaller herds. The major enemy of Muskoxen is the Wolf.

In case of danger, the herd forms a circle. The young calves are protected in the center and the mature animals form a protective ring with their horns facing outward. Horns of mature bulls reach lengths of 50 cm to 65 cm. These seemingly huge animals with longhaired, thick and dark brown to black coats have impressive trophies with a high scarcity value. Hunting this primeval game species in the rough but fascinating landscape is an experience that enthuses every hunter!

Muskoxen are hard to bring down. Please use calibers from 30-06 and larger with heavy bullets.



Reindeer

Reindeer have lived in the Arctic for thousands of years and during that time have made up a major part of the staple diet of humans living in the area. The Reindeer in South – Greenland are a mixture of the original Greenland Caribou and Reindeer that were imported from Norway around 1900.

The reindeer in Greenland belongs to the deer family and is the only species of deer in Greenland. At the same time the reindeer is the most widespread land mammal in Greenland and can be found on most of the south & west coast.

The reindeer is a shy animal, and reacts very quickly to sudden sounds or movements as well as the smell of strangers. If one catches your scent, the reindeer can gallop away at a speed of 70 kilometers an hours (45 mph).

In South of Greenland you will find the largest Reindeer trophies in Greenland.

HUNT IN SOUTH GREENLAND

Travel details / Hunt

Departing from Germany, you fly via Copenhagen or Iceland to Greenland, arrival airport is Narsarsuaq. Guests are welcomed at the airport by a staff member or by the outfitter himself. After the reception at the airport there is around 2 ½ - 3 hours boat transfer (closed boat) to the Camp where the hunting is discussed in detail with the Camp manager.

The guides working in Greenland are locals who have grown up in the area and are familiar with this wilderness. You can confide in them without hesitation. You stay in the camp the whole time of your journey. The summer/fall camp is equipped with twelve double bed cabins, kitchen and dining cabin, toilet, sauna and showers. In our camp in South of Greenland (not in winter hunts). You can also access internet connection (slow) and there is a satellite and radio communication to call for assistance in case of emergency.

Safety is the first priority here. However, during all the hunts in the past years there have never been any noteworthy problems. If you have shot a bull the horns and coat are packed safely and transported back to the camp. We do not use any dogs during the summer/fall hunts!

While hunting in Greenland it is necessary to have warm clothes as the weather is unpredictable.

DAY 01

Journey to Copenhagen or Reykjavik, overnight stay in Copenhagen or Reykjavik.

DAY 02

Flight Narsarsuaq, Meet & Greet and boat transfer to the camp.

DAY 03 – 06 (or longer depending on trip)

Hunting days

For the Muskox hunts you leave early morning with the guides by boat to travel to the hunting grounds. You will go by car to the hunting area. From there you will stalk the animals by foot.

Reindeer hunts are start early morning where the hunter, along with a local guide, searches the many islands around the camp for the trophies. In many cases you will spot the animals close to the shorelines. Be prepared for a journey of 4-6 hours.

DAY 07

Flight Narsarsuaq – Copenhagen or Reykjavik, overnight stay in Copenhagen or Reykjavik.

HUNT IN WEST GREENLAND

Travel details / Hunt

In our new program, our hunters will need to be in reasonable physical shape. In autumn hunts, hikes can be longer, and we recommend it only to well-trained hunters. However, winter hunts require moderate physical fitness, as they are easier as snow allows transport by snowmobile.

The new operation, located around the town of Kangerlussuaq, has easy flight connections through Keflavik Iceland with Air Iceland and through Copenhagen Denmark with Air Greenland.

FALL HUNT:

The Muskox fall hunts are open for two months, August and September each year. All trips we offer are six days and consist of four days hunting with the first and the last day for travel. We will have one guide for every two hunters with maximum four clients during each trip.

As of 2016, a new ATV trail will be constructed to the hunting area. However, as in any improvement, it can be delayed so here we will explain our transport for autumn 2016 as if it the authorities have not constructed it. However, if built, it will shorten the transportation the first and last day by 2-3 hours.

Weather:

You can expect various temperatures during fall hunts. From pleasant summer days around 10 to 20 degrees to cold days around 0 degrees. However, the further you arrive into to September the more likely you will get colder temperatures. As temperatures can vary, hunters need to have warm clothes, preferably several thin layers than one thick and to bring with tem Gore-Tex hunting boots.

Accommodation:

The Main Camp consists of several tents. It has a large comfortable kitchen tent which can be heated when cold. There we have a table and bench. The temperature in the tent during the day will be around 20 degrees so hunters can dry their clothes in the tent. We also have smaller sleeping tents with mattresses, a tent for food storage, and a separate tent with a dry toilet.

The Forward camp is more primitive than the other camp. There we have one large tent that has a cooking island with an oven in the middle, and mattresses around it. The Forward Camp is used when out hunting and the food we serve there is plainer than in the Main camp.

At the Main camp, we offer easily cooked meals. Hunter's can expects oatmeal, bread and cold cuts in the mornings along with water, tea and coffee. While hunting far from camp freeze dried food will be available. In the evenings reindeer and muskox steaks will be served.

Hunters can bring beer or soft drinks with them, however, keep in mind that you will have to carry them.

Journey to Copenhagen or Iceland, overnight stay in Copenhagen or Iceland.

DAY 02

Flights to Kangerlussuaq, at arrival, hunters are greeted by a representative in Kangerlussuaq airport. From there, we take you to Kangerlussuaq Youth Hostel where you get repacked, change clothes, and have dinner. If needed, we will take the time to go to a shooting range to set up rifles.

When everything is set up, hunters travel by jeep as far as it can take them. From there, you will need to carry your luggage and equipment around 2 km to a lake. We sail the last part of the journey, to the first camp, the Main Camp. Here hunters get settled into the cabin and spend the first night. The trip takes approx. 5 hours.

The area, around the Main camp, is remote, and the locals usually do not go any further to hunt. However, the central Muskox area is another 6-7 km hike from the Main camp. Here we have set up the Forward Camp. It is a primitive tent camp but comfortable for 5-6 people. From here, it's only a few km to a larger lake where we have a boat that we can use for transport around the area. Hunters will be asked to help with practical work in both camps.

DAY 03 – 06

Hunting days begin in the early morning, either from the Main or Forward Camp. After a good breakfast, hunters follow the guide around the area in search of a Muskox. Often, a boat is used to get to the prime areas. When you have successfully shot your trophy, you will have to assist the guides in carrying the trophy and meat back to camp. Depending where the animal is shot boats are used to help moving trophies but rest by foot.

If hunters have time, there are several other hunting opportunities in the area. Reindeer, Arctic foxes, Ptarmigan and Arctic hares. It's good to have in mind that every hunting day is flexible; the guide will adjust the plan according to the location of animals, weather forecast and hunter's condition.

In these hunts, we have up to 4 hunters at a time and one guide per two hunters. We can accommodate non-hunters, as long as they can carry their equipment. Non-hunters can walk along during the hunt, or stay in the camp at will. However, during the day, there will be no guide in the camp.

DAY 07

Transport to Kangerlussuaq with accommodation at a Youth Hostel.

DAY 08

Departure flight around 10.00 to Copenhagen or Iceland and overnight stay.

WINTER HUNT:

The Muskox winter hunts are open for two months, March and April each year. All trips we offer are six days and consist of four days hunting with the first and the last day for travel. We will have one guide for every two hunters with maximum four clients during each trip. If applicable, that includes non-hunters.

Weather:

Hunters can expect cold temperatures from -10 to -15 degrees during the daytime and -25 at night. Keep in mind that temperatures can vary a lot; thus, hunters need to have warm clothes, preferably several thin layers than one thick and to bring with them Gore-Tex hunting boots.



OPTION 1:

Accommodation: The hunting camp we offer is a rustic and comfortable cabin. It has three twin bedrooms (winter sleeping bags included), a large central area where with kitchen and dining table and finally a bathroom with a dry toilet. In the central room, we have a wood stove and a kerosene heater to warm the house. Hunters will be asked to help with practical work in the camp.

At camp, we offer simply cooked meals. Hunters can expect oatmeal, bread and cold cuts in the mornings along with water, tea and coffee. While hunting far from camp freeze dried food will be available. In the evenings reindeer and muskox steaks will be served. Hunters can bring beer or soft drinks with them, however, keep in mind that these drinks can quickly freeze.

Camp Winter hunt





Possible Itinerary for Winter hunt:

DAY 01

Journey to Copenhagen or Iceland, overnight stay in Copenhagen or Iceland.

DAY 02

Flights to Kangerlussuaq, at arrival, hunters are greeted by Lax-á's representative in Kangerlussuaq. From the airport, we take you to Kangerlussuaq Youth Hostel where you get repacked, change clothes and have dinner. If needed, we will take the time to go to a shooting range to set up rifles.

When everything is set up, hunters travel by snowmobiles or ATV's to the hunting area and get settled into the camp. Hunters can expect travel time around 2 hours as the area is about 50 km Southwest of town.

DAY 03 – 06

Hunting days start early morning. The guide, along with hunters, locates the animals while traveling on a snowmobile. When the animal's area discovered you will need to walk to get within shooting range of your trophy. When hunters have successfully shot their Muskoxen, you will have to assist the guides packing the trophy and meat. It is then transported with the snowmobile.

If hunters have time, there are several other hunting opportunities in the area. Reindeer, Arctic foxes, Ptarmigan and Arctic hares. It's good to have in mind that every hunting day is flexible; the guide will adjust the plan according to the location of animals, weather forecast and hunter's condition.

DAY 07

Transport to Kangerlussuaq with accommodation at a Youth Hostel.

DAY 08

Departure flight around 10.00 to Copenhagen or Iceland and overnight stay.

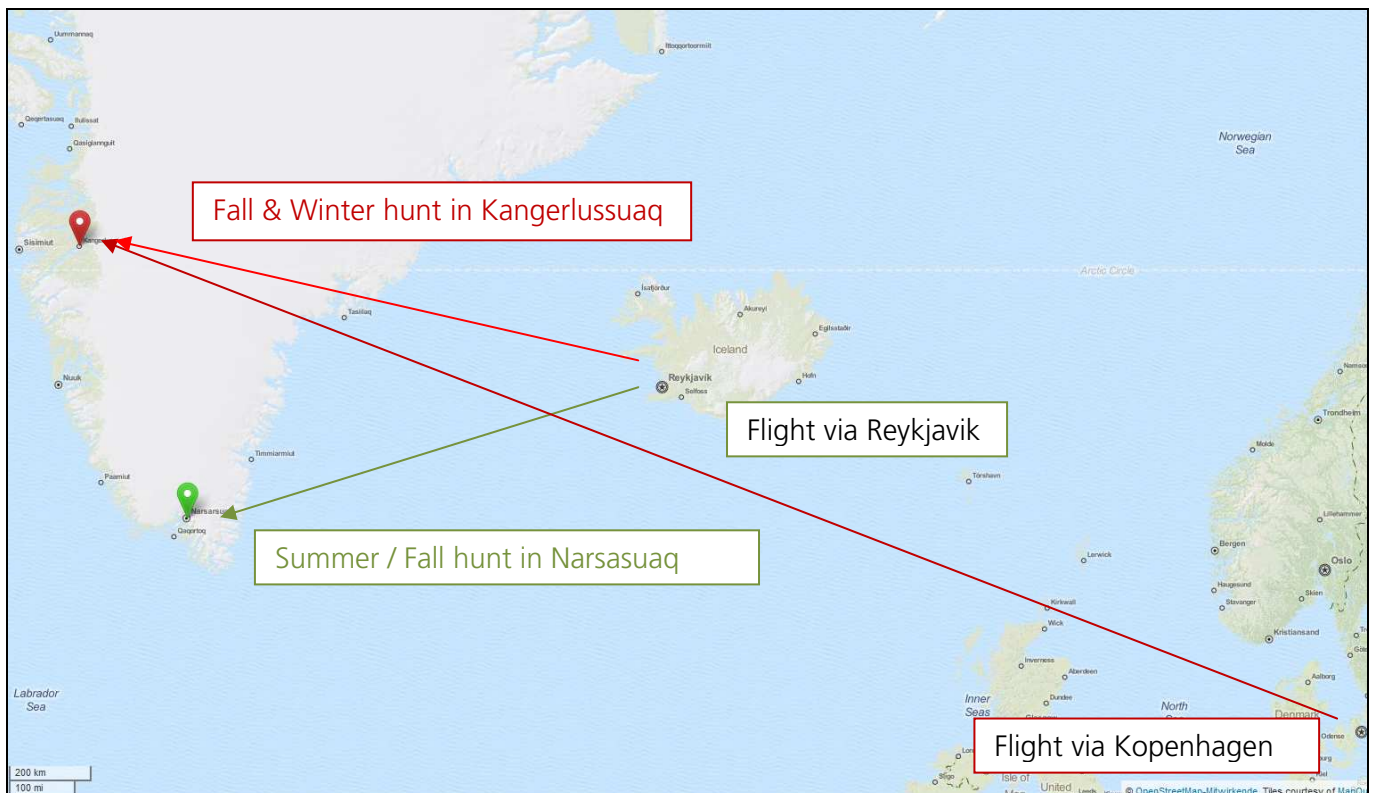

Recommended equipment for South & West Greenland:

Equipment recommended for the Summer / Fall hunt Period August & September:

When hunting, be prepared for temperatures: in July & August to be from 0 to +18 C° and in September from -5 to +15 C°

- Wind-tight and waterproofed outdoor wear, preferable breathable
- War, sweater, i.e. fleece or wool
- Long underwear
- Gloves
- Hat
- Waterproofed hiking shoes
- Light shoes for the camp area
- Slippers to use inside the cabin
- Thick socks
- Extra clothes to change
- Outfit for sauna
- Sunglasses
- Mosquito spray, Mosquito net over head
- Sun lotion
- Lip-balsam
- "on to go" closed bottle for water etc.
- GPS device
- Pocket knife
- Small backpack
- Light binoculars
- Flashlight / headlight

Equipment recommended for the Winter hunt Period March & April:

When hunting in winter, be prepared for temperatures: from -15 to -30 C° (very dry cold). Sealskin outer clothing is absolutely necessary and can be rented on site. You can also rent a sleeping bag.

- Small backpack
- Warm mittens
- Full-fingered gloves
- Warm, long underwear
- Fleece trousers and jacket
- Loden trousers or the like
- Ski mask
- Heating pads or hand warmers
- Lip balm.

- Flashlight / headlight
