GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT UGANDA

The Republic of Uganda is a country in Eastern and Central Africa bordered in the east by Kenya, in the North by Sudan, by the Democratic Republic of Congo in the West, Rwanda in the Southwest and Tanzania in the South.

The southern part of the country includes a substantial portion of Lake Victoria, within which it shares borders with Kenya and Tanzania. Uganda takes its name from the historical Buganda kingdom, which encompasses a portion of the south of the country, including the capital city of Kampala.

Uganda is located on the East African Plateau, averaging about 1,100 meters (3,600 feet) above sea level, which slopes steadily downwards to the Sudanese Plain to the north. Much of the south is poorly drained, while the center is dominated by Lake Kyoga and surrounding marshy areas.

KAMPALA AND IN THE FIELD

Upon arrival at Entebbe Int. airport and departure, depending on your flight schedule, you will be accommodated in a good three-star hotel in Kampala. The staff will pick you up at the airport and drop you off.

Your lodging in the field will be either in colonial style East African tents (Kafu & Karamoja blocks) or traditional grass thatched tented bungalows (Mayanja Lodge) serviced by a well trained staff.

The field cooks provide three solid meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner) per day. The cooking in the restaurants samples different kitchens such as Indian, African, German, Italian and Chinese.

All the camps and lodges are semi-permanent structures equipped with 24/7 power supply and satellite internet. The internet can only be used for emails and Skype calls.



HUNTING CONCESSIONS

KAFU RIVER BASIN

The Kafu River Basin stretches along Lake Kyoga, Kafu and Myanja Rivers and covers the six districts of Nakaseke, Nakasongola, Kiboga, Kyankwanzi, Kiryandongo and Masindi covering about 420,000 hectares.

The landscape in Kafu consist mainly of papyrus swamps and dense bush thickest making it a prime hunting ground for the East African Sitatunga, East African Bush Duiker, Eastern Bohor Reedbuck, Nile Bushbuck, East African Defassa Waterbuck.....

The hunt in Kafu from January to December. This is the best concession for big Sitatunga.

ASWA LOLIM RANCHES

Many commercial farmers have settled in this prime hunting ground. Her you can hunt for Nile Buffalo, Uganda Kob, Hartebeest, Waterbuck, Oribi and warthog.

AswaL olim lies on the eastern side of the Nile.

It covers 45,000 hectares and shares 110 km direct border with Muchison Falls National Park in the South . The landscape is dominated by rolling grass hills with palm trees, small valleys with creeks and light forest.

The hunt in Aswa Lolim from January to end of April/May.

KARAMOJA NORTH

Karamoja concessions are stretching over 1,2 million hectares from Kidepo Valley National Park all the way to central Karamoja. They include 6 Districts (Karenga, Kitgum, Agago, Kaabong Kotido and Abim) and are rich in Buffalo, Jackson's Hartebeest, Oribi, Eastern Bohor Reedbuck, Mountain Reedbuck, Gunthers's Dik Dik, East African Defassa Waterbuck, Warthog and the Sudan Maneless zebra.

Currently we operate out of one camp situated in the Karenga Community Wildlife area,. In 2022 more camps opened to spread out to other prime hunting grounds.

DAY 01	Departure from Europe

- Charters basically only needed to go to Karamoja or for going back to Kampala from Karamoja. All other areas do not need charters as the driving time is relatively short with about 4 to 6 hours.

HUNTING SEASON

- Our hunting season is from January through November. It rains all year round (which is why the country is so lush) with slightly more rain on average in April-June and November. However, the rainfall varies from year-to-year. Some species move with the rain, but we hunt where the animals are.
- The best time to hunt Buffalo and Hartebeest is during the months of December to end of April. After that the grass is too high and hunting buffalo becomes challenging. All other species may be hunted year round.

SITATUNGA HUNTING

- Our safaris for the elusive ghost of the swamp, the Sitatunga, are undertaken in the Kafu River Basin and in the papyrus belts along the banks of River Nile. Our areas hold the highest density of Sitatunga anywhere in Africa. Our areas hold the highest density of Sitatunga anywhere in Africa. It is not uncommon to see between seven to 25 Sitatunga (males, females & young ones) daily in the course of your safari. Sitatunga hunting involves quite a bit of preparation. Before the start of a safari the papyrus has to be slashed at least three to four weeks ahead of time and a cerebeti (elevated platform) must be built in either a tree or on floating papyrus.
- Hunting areas include Aswa-Lolim, Karamoja North and South, Kafu River Basin and Lake Mburo represented by the red stars in the map. The map shows also the driving distance between selected areas.
- Flight charters are available directly from Entebbe to Kidepo at an additional cost (around USD 2,900) for a maximum of 2 people or USD 5,000 for more than 2 people.
- Safaris can start in Mayanja, Asw-Lolim or Karamoja depending on camp occupancy.

RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT

Clothing and Equipment

Lightweight clothing is adequate (long or short sleeves and pants) with a jacket or sweater for the evenings or early mornings. Dark khaki or green are the preferred colors. Be sure to pack some light rain gear because it is common to experience some rain several days per month in some regions. Bring good binoculars and a day pack for your camera, extra ammunition and incidentals. A spotting scope, range finder, and walking stick are optional. We also strongly recommend that you bring rubber boots and waders for hunting. In the morning hours we have quite a lot of dew.

Mobil phone and charger

Mini sewing kit

Lighter / waterproof matches

Toiletries such as toothbrush, toothpaste, comb/ hair brushes, nail brush

Moistering Cream, Lip balm

Razor & blades, shaving gel

Toilet paper and/or kleenex, wet wipes/hand sanitizer or no-water/antibacterial soap – very handy in the safari vehicle
